The film is directed, written and produced by the Venezuelan filmmaker and photographer: Maria Millan. Her talent lies in breath-taking beautiful storytelling, as she utilises the subtle art of tension. Her fashion videos and pictures effortlessly bring buried emotion and sentiment to the surface. 


The Refuge will loop from 6 to 8 pm and the Q & A will start right after that.
