She is currently serving patients at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) in Washington, D.C. Karen earned her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Hampton University in 1985, followed by her Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) from Wayne State University in 1998. She then went on to receive her Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) from Rush University in 2009.

In order to stay up to date in her field, Karen maintains professional memberships with the Lean Green Yellow Belt (Leadership Courses), the International Honor Society Sigma Theta Tau, the American Nurses Association, and the American Academy of Pain Management.

Pain medicine is a medical specialty that focuses on the evaluation, treatment, and prevention of pain. A pain management specialist, also known as a pain doctor or a pain specialist, is a medical doctor (M.D.) or doctor of osteopathy (D.O.) who specializes in pain medicine. They specialize in the management of pain as a symptom of the disease (eudynia) and primary pain disorders (maldynia). Furthermore, they treat patients who experience pain related to a specific cause (e.g., cancer pain, injury, postoperative pain) and patients who suffer pain as a primary condition (e.g., frequent headaches, neuropathic pain).
