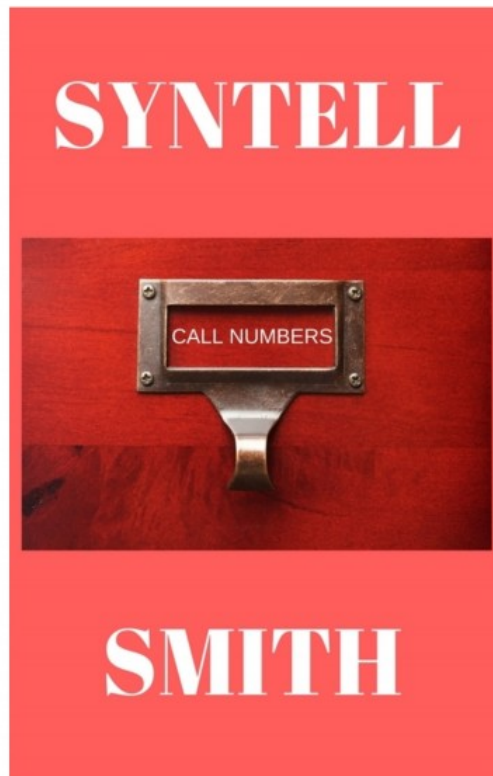


Self-Published Author chronicles the "The not so quiet life of librarians..." in "Call Numbers"
