
## Illinois Author Brings Families Together with Mystery-Filled Poem

"The reading aloud of this whimsical, fun tale is an excellent exercise in both meter and rhyme for young children. The cadence throughout is similar to Clement Clarke Moore's famous childhood poem of 1823, "A Visit from St. Nicholas", where we read, "Twas the night before Christmas and all through the house." In fact, Frankfort's work is set in the same anapestic tetrameter as is that most famous of children's Christmastime rhyming books. With an AABB rhyme scheme, Frankfort's book here is also a wonderfully entertaining wintertime story about and for little boys and girls. And, like Moore's classic, this children's rhyme also provokes a great sense of wonder and excitement, which is sure to entertain little ones during Christmas or, frankly, any time of the year," says Jonah Meyer of The US Review of Books.
