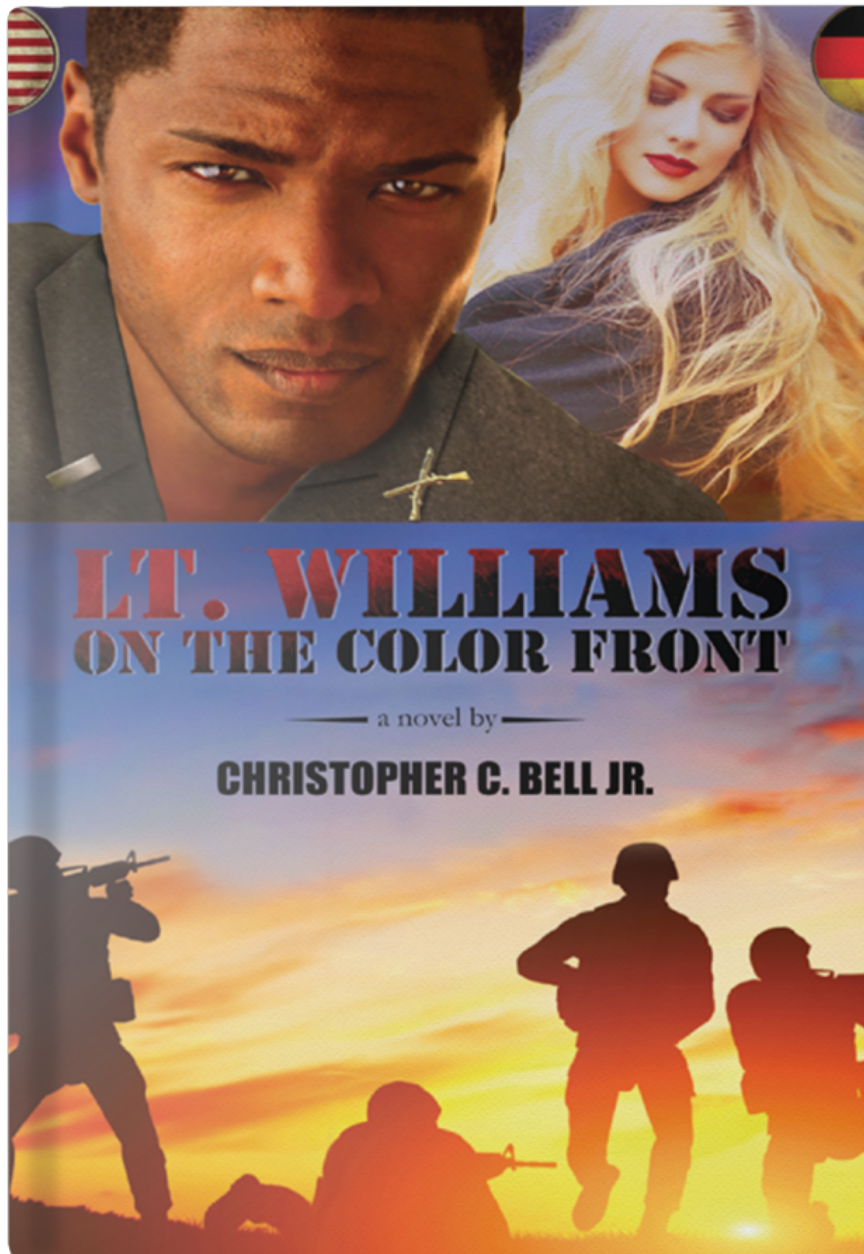


Author Launches New Book on the Life of a Man of Color in the Military

Strength and determination in the face of adversity.



London, Mar 2, 2020 (IssueWire.com) - Back to the early 1950s when racism and racial segregation was eminent right within the U.S. military itself, [Lt. Williams on the Color Front](#) by Christopher C. Bell Jr. reflects that time in Germany when desegregation efforts in the Army have commenced. Author Bell drives an action-packed plot amidst prejudice and discrimination.

The book centers on a young black lieutenant who is newly assigned to be the platoon leader of an all-white Army Infantry Regiment. Although circumstances have been anything but easy and pleasant, Lieutenant Neal Williams struggles not to waver through this significantly tough challenge. As he fights back with exceptional determination, his adversaries are also highly persistent with their resistance to a seemingly ambitious attempt on desegregation. How long can he keep his stand against his nemesis and dilemmas? Would he be as unyielding to keep himself faithful to his girlfriend when he's surrounded by women ready to comfort any soldier, no matter the color?

Christopher C. Bell Jr. takes pride in his black ethnicity. He is an essayist, a poet, and an educator on racial and ethnicity studies. He earned his EdD from Boston University Graduate School of Education. Bell is also a retired major of the US Army who served in Germany as a lieutenant during the 1950s. He also had the opportunity to serve in Vietnam and Ethiopia and twice in both France and Korea. These arrangements which took him to different countries opened his mind and broadened his understanding of different cultures and races.

Bell's work will be featured at the London Book Fair 2020, to be held at Olympia, London this coming March 10-12 at the Authors Press booth 1E38.

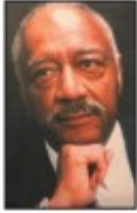

This novel "LT. Williams on the Color Front" harkens back to the racism and racial segregation in the U.S. Army in the early 1950s in Germany when the Army began racial desegregation efforts. Often, such efforts prompted White-against-Black face-offs or virtual white "Color Fronts" of resistance against desegregation. This novel is the tense, action-filled story of Negro Lieutenant Neal Williams' coming of age as he struggles against the efforts of prejudiced white officers who scheme to prevent him from succeeding as a newly assigned platoon leader in what has been an all-white infantry regiment.

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Christopher C. Bell Jr. is a black man, a poet, an essayist, a lecturer on racial and ethnicity studies, a Doctor of Education (Boston University Graduate School of Education), and a retired Army major who served as a lieutenant in Germany during the 1950s. He also served in Korea (twice), France (twice), Vietnam, and Ethiopia. These assignments and travels expanded his awareness and sensitivity about peoples and cultures and moved him to write about his experiences.
