In Sensible Bridge, readers will discover the emotional impact of the Lao people's carefully preserved indigenous music, dances and rituals. Certain poems describe her region's recently UNESCO-registered Khaen music, played on a bamboo mouth organ. Folk imagery further enriches the ethnographic portrait of the writer's work. Lao Buddhism is also integral to the book's aesthetics and moral vision.

Readers will detect a particularly lilting quality in Phiulavanh Luangvanna's poetry due to the writer's engagement with singing. Continuing the traditions of Laos, where poetry often converges with song, dance, theater and other arts, the writer has composed and performed poetry for singing in her native language. Suggestions of narrative and religious musicality also emerge in the book's English versions.

In light of Laos's long isolation, linked with political antagonism and upheaval, Mundus Artium takes special pride in Sensible Bridge as a contribution to diversity in contemporary worldviews. Inseparably from showing the enduring beauty of Laos's scenery and customs, Phiulavanh Luangvanna memorializes the country's struggles. One poem recalls the "living legend of Viengxai," the "cave city" where the future architects of a post-colonial Laos took shelter during years of heavy bombing by the United States during the country's civil war. Finding a positive lineage in the story of Laos's longtime socialism, as in related national sovereignty movements, Sensible Bridge will remind readers that the world must accommodate varied allegiances.

Sensible Bridge's compassionate vision will find resonance with readers intrigued by Asian cultures, as well as with all those seeking firmer values for their own lives. Phiulavanh Luangvanna's love of justice, community and worship represent forces for unity and wisdom in divided, distracted times. She brings a message of dialog and hopes from Laos to the whole world.
