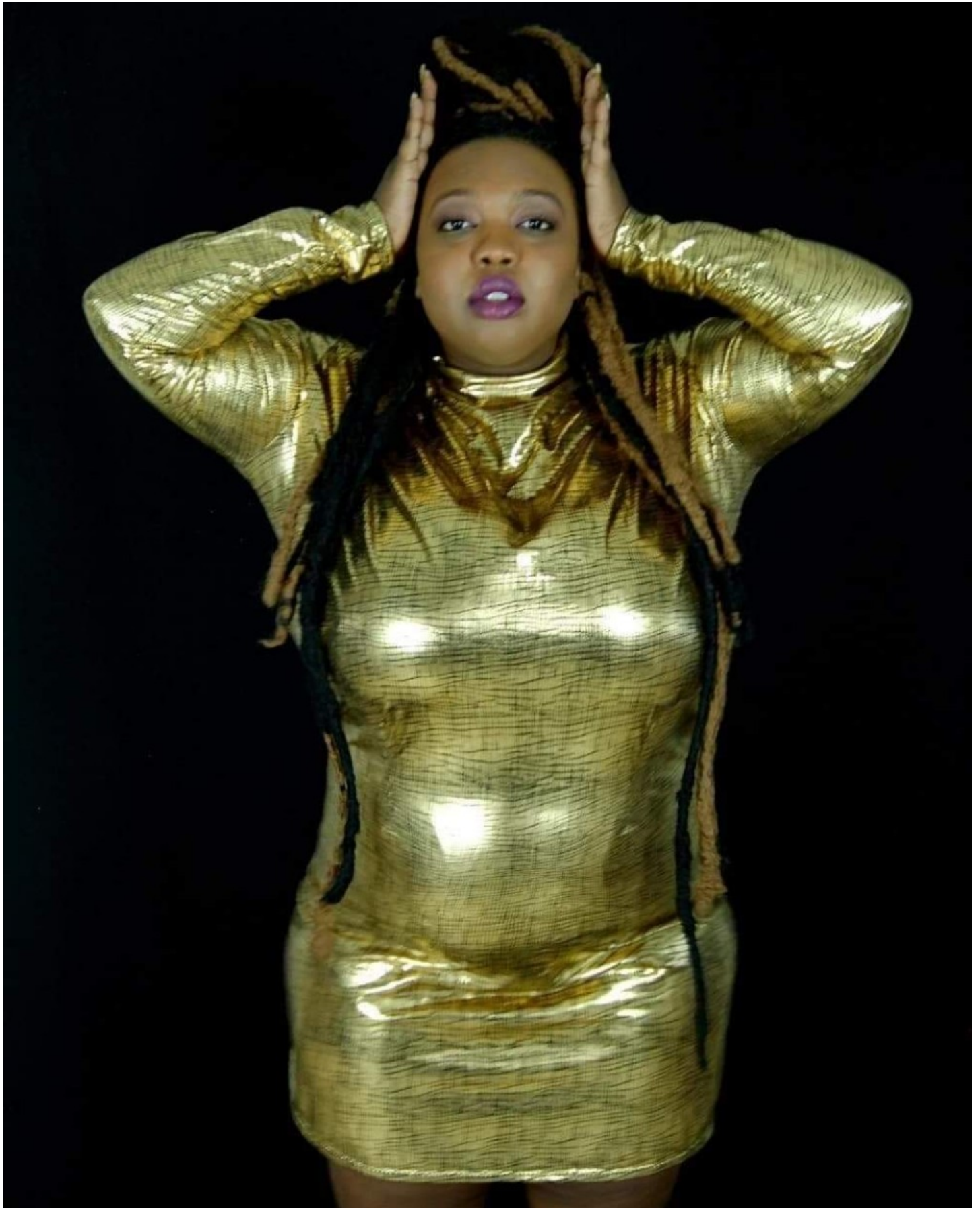


International Recording Artist TooSweet to sit down with world-renown Chef Wenford Simpson

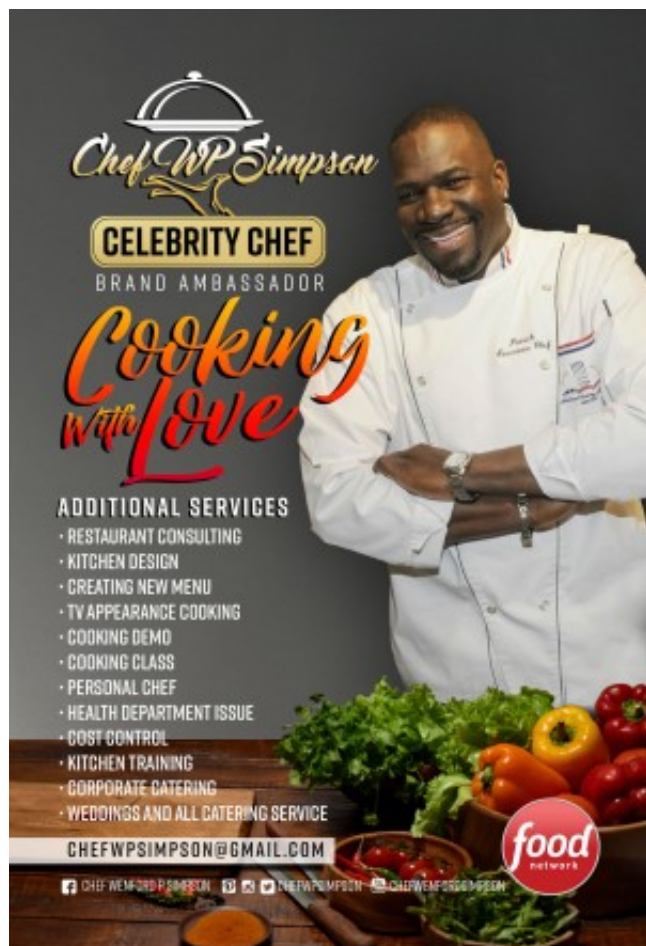
Earlier in 2020, TooSweet shared her individual style on the stage in Uganda, electrifying the crowds with her strong voice and powerful vocal ability.
