## Live from COVID-19 Launches, giving an all-inclusive calendar of online events during the global pandemic

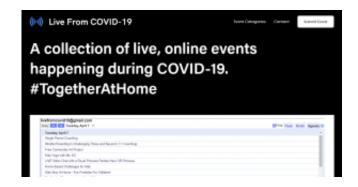
