The series highlights four characters—Madison Miles, Olivia Jackson, Mackenzie Owens and Jihan Taylor— a diverse group of black girls who each have a love for learning. For example, Madison loves science, and Olivia adores math. It's a fun, educational series for transitional readers.

"My reason for writing this series was two-fold, I saw the need for students of color to see themselves in the books they were reading, but I also saw a need for students who were not of color to read about children they don't see every day. In addition to this, a third-grade law was created in Michigan that would hold children back if they could not read at a third-grade level," said author Dara Nichole.

In 2016, the Michigan Legislature passed a law that requires schools to identify learners who are struggling with reading and writing and to provide additional help to those students. The law also states that third graders may repeat third grade if they are more than one grade level behind beginning with the 2019-20 school year.
