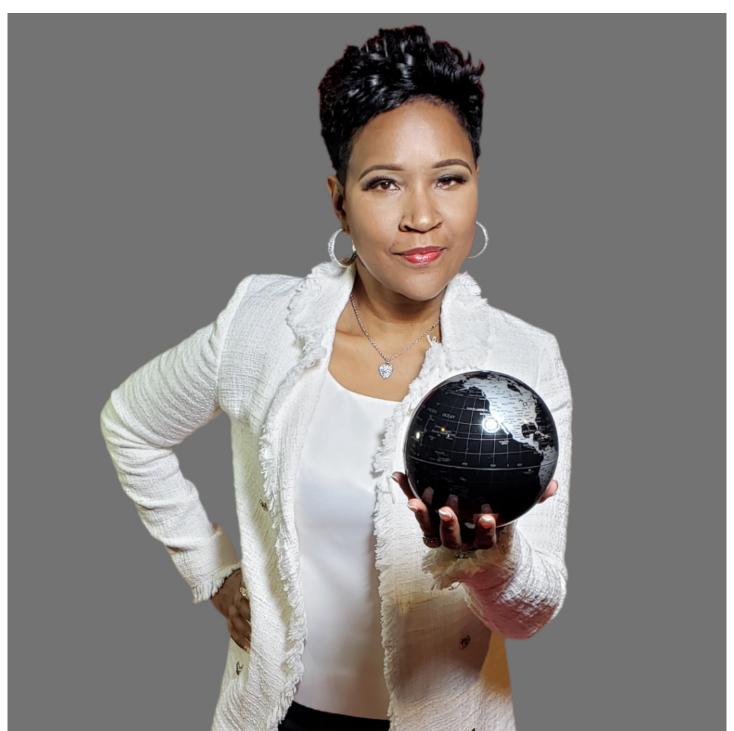
Beyond Borders: How One Female Entrepreneur Is Breaking Down Barriers for Women in International Trade
