The second recipient from Mississippi is leaning toward food service delivery and tells us, "All the services that Mom Bomb is offering are very wonderful and I had a hard time choosing only one. Especially between food and laundry...But I am very grateful and excited for the help, I will be receiving." Syntyche hasn't been able to work because of a high-risk pregnancy and struggling to prepare for her "bundle of joy."

Mom Bomb was created to fund its non-profit, Mom Bomb Giving after its Founder went through a catastrophic medical condition herself and vowed to live her life trying to make it easier for others going through a crisis.
