His ability to educate and guide his students, residents, and fellows has earned him "Best Teacher Award" nominations year after year.

Board-certified through the American Board of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and the American Board of Otolaryngology - Head & Neck Surgery, Dr. Gantous is a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Canada, the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery, the Canadian Society of Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery, the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and the Canadian Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery.
