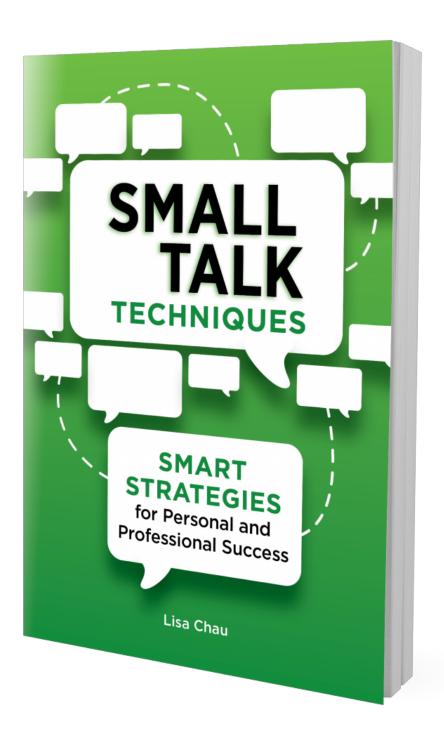
Power Skills Combat Personal Loneliness, Nurture Professional Network

Chau offers readers a range of simple ways to start, maintain, and exit conversations gracefully; listen actively; and keep others interested and engaged. Readers are taught to navigate any conversation; adapt to changing social dynamics with ease; and open doors for trust, credibility, and future success.

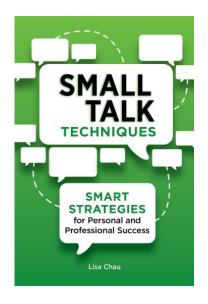

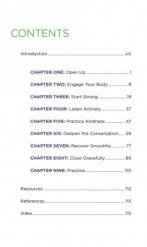
