The contest will run from Feb 9 to Feb 22. Only 200 entries will be accepted.

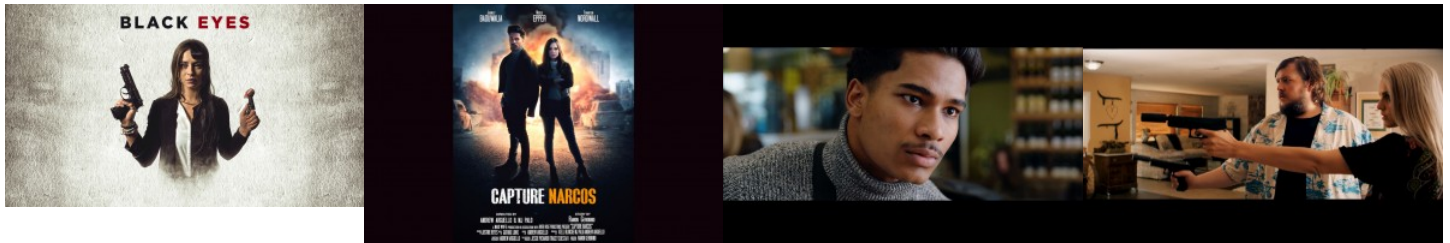
Every entry will receive a screenplay analysis.
