A geriatrician is a health care provider who focuses on patient well-being and independent functioning. These allopathic or osteopathic health care providers are specifically trained to evaluate and manage the unique health care needs and special treatment requirements of older people.

Enjoying giving back to his community, Dr. Ferdaus has participated in many volunteer activities, including serving as an executive member of the Bangladesh Medical Association of North America. He acquired the first position at the Bronx County Medical Society Annual Poster competition in New York in 2013 and was a finalist in a poster presentation at the American Thoracic Society International Conferences in California in 2012.
