Over 150 volunteer tutors that span a multitude of educational, professional, and diverse backgrounds commit their time and energy to tutor underserved Bay Area students throughout the region every day of the week, including weekends. Partnering with local school districts and foundations, non-profit organizations and securing funding from Hewlett Packard Inc., Amazon, KLA-Tencor, Cisco, BATA has arranged teams of compassionate, dedicated, and accomplished tutors that hail from around the world, all joined together by their commitment to BATA's mission of educational equity for all.

Founding Director Chris Norwood states, "Due to COVID-19, we've had to pivot quickly, streamline our volunteer recruitment process to create a diversity-filled, international network of talented and committed volunteers who can better connect with the underserved public school children of the San Francisco Bay Area and Silicon Valley. We are now able to secure more donations to education and offer more tutoring support scholarships than ever for low-income families."
