He returned to his hometown, attending Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas. He then completed his residency at Miami Children's Hospital (now known as Nicklaus Children's).

A Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics (FAAP), he is board-certified in pediatrics by the American Board of Pediatrics (ABP). The mission of the ABP is to advance child health by certifying pediatricians who meet standards of excellence and are committed to continuous learning and improvement.

In his professional experience, Dr. Floyd serves as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of St. Philip's Episcopal School, as a member of the Board of Trustees of Westminster Christian School, and as a member of the Pediatric/Child Health Committee at South Miami Hospital. He makes regular television appearances, speaking on a variety of pediatric topics, and is also a speaker too many local church and civic groups.

In the state of Florida, he is affiliated with Baptist Hospital of Miami, Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Baptist Health South Miami Hospital, and Mercy Hospital Miami.
