Ring offers two extra plans for those who desire extra security and features: Basic (\$3/month for one device) and Plus (\$10/month for all devices).

It's worth noting that Ring's website doesn't say how many devices this Plus plan can support, so it may be an unlimited number, but that's a bit confusing. Premier (\$2.99/month for one device) and Elite (\$4.99/month for one camera or \$14.99/month for five cameras) are two more programs offered by Arlo.

The subscription fees for the two brands appear to be similar at first sight. Although Arlo's Elite plan offers a significant price difference between \$4.99 and \$14.99, if you simply want a monthly subscription plan for two cameras, for example, you'll be in a tight place.

What's more, what features do you receive for your money with both brands' most advanced plans? Except for a few differences, most of the characteristics for both brands are the same. The storage strategy is an important component of a home security system. If you run out of memory, you won't be able to save crucial information, which could cause problems later. Ring claims to save the footage for up to 60 days, while Arlo only offers half of that amount of Cloud storage.

But don't dismiss Arlo's Elite plan just yet — for \$4.99, you'll gain access to the brand's e911 Emergency Call Service, which is an incredible feature in which the business knows which responders are closest to your home and can even disclose your location before you tell them. This remarkable trait has the potential to save a person's life, making it helpful to everyone.

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Battery Life Span

The battery life of Arlo's outdoor security cameras is six months between charges. Ring, on the other hand, claims that their wireless camera range has a battery life of up to 12 months, however, this varies depending on the number of activations. Solar versions are available from both brands for less frequent recharging.

Application Features & Design

You'll need a user-friendly design that's not too difficult to use with live monitoring and other capabilities from the apps. Let's look at the application features and design for this Arlo vs. Ring review.

The ring allows you to receive criminal alerts from your neighbors via the app. The app is also where you'll get notifications when the camera detects motion — which may be in one of the pre-defined zones. You can see and speak with visitors using the app. Alternatively, you can check in to see how your home's interior and exterior are doing in real-time. Furthermore, while Ring works with Amazon Alexa, it does not work with Apple HomeKit.

Arlo, on the other hand, offers rich notifications and image previews, as well as HomeKit connectivity and compatibility with the Apple Watch app. Arlo also allows you to respond to alarms without having to unlock your phone.

Smart Home Integration

Both Arlo and Ring cameras and doorbells will work with speech assistants, allowing you to chat with anyone in the camera's field of view and view a live feed from the camera on the best smart displays using the finest smart speakers.

Arlo is the clear winner here, as all of their home security cameras and video doorbells work with Amazon Alexa and Google Assistant, and some of their devices even work with Apple HomeKit, with further compatibility for Apple's system coming soon to some of the new items, such as the Arlo Video Doorbell.

Ring's cameras and video doorbells are exclusively compatible with Alexa, which isn't surprising given that Amazon bought the firm in 2018. Ring devices are an obvious choice if you have Alexa installed in your house.
