In order to obtain a license as a social worker with A-levels (LBSW), one must obtain a bachelor's degree in social work and a license according to the requirements of the respective jurisdiction. To become a Licensed Master of Social Workers (LMSW), you may need to obtain a Master's degree in Social Work and a license in accordance with the requirements of your jurisdiction.
