In order to recover, however, their accident needs to have been the result of someone else's legal negligence. Some of the more common causes of T-bone accidents that are usually attributable to driver negligence are discussed below. Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is one of the most common causes of T-bone accidents. In many cases, distracted drivers simply fail to see a stop sign or red light and blow through intersections, colliding with traffic moving perpendicularly to their path.

Impaired Driving

Drunk and drugged driving is another common cause of T-bone accidents. Sometimes, drunk drivers are unaware of cross-traffic patterns and drive into other vehicles. In others, they may not react quickly enough to stoplights and drive into an intersection when they don't have the right-of-way.

Failure to Yield

When drivers fail to yield the right-of-way to traffic, it can result in serious T-bone accidents. For example, if a driver takes a right turn into traffic without yielding, oncoming traffic may hit the side of their car. Similarly, if a driver fails to yield the right of way at a 4-way stop, serious T-bone accidents can happen.

Driving without Headlights

Avoiding collisions requires drivers to be able to see traffic. If a driver is driving without headlights at night or in poor weather, a driver driving into an intersection may not be able to see oncoming traffic, potentially resulting in a serious t-bone collision.

What Should You Do After a T-Bone Accident?

After a T-bone accident, there are certain steps you should take to protect your rights. Perhaps most importantly, you should seek medical attention as soon as you can. Not only will seeing a doctor protect your health, it will also result in the creation of a medical record detailing your injuries.

Next, you should contact an attorney as soon as you can. Car insurance companies aggressively try to settle cases for as little as possible and are not above using high-pressure tactics to get you to sign away your rights. Once you have an attorney, however, the insurance company will have to deal with your lawyer directly, ensuring that you do not inadvertently accept a settlement lower than your case's value.
