Moreover, he is a board-certified specialist in clinical hypertension by The American Hypertension Specialist Certification Program, which was formed by the American Society of Hypertension in 1998 in response to the growing recognition that the hypertension problem requires the coordinated effort of front-line health care providers and those physicians with documented expertise in managing hypertension.

As for his academic appointment, Dr. Paras serves as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Frank H. Netter School of Medicine at Quinnipiac in North Haven, Connecticut.
