A general surgeon performs a wide range of abdominal surgeries for many forms of intestinal and abdominal wall neoplasms, gallbladder disease, gastric and pancreatic disease. They follow the patient through critical care and surgical recovery all the way to outpatient care.

Throughout her acclaimed career, Dr. Coomer has been the recipient of the Patients' Choice Award (2018, 2017, 2008), and Compassionate Doctor Recognition (2018, 2017, 2016).
