This Press Release is written to inform the readers that Stacey Ribotsky has been contributing to make a difference to the lives of those in need.

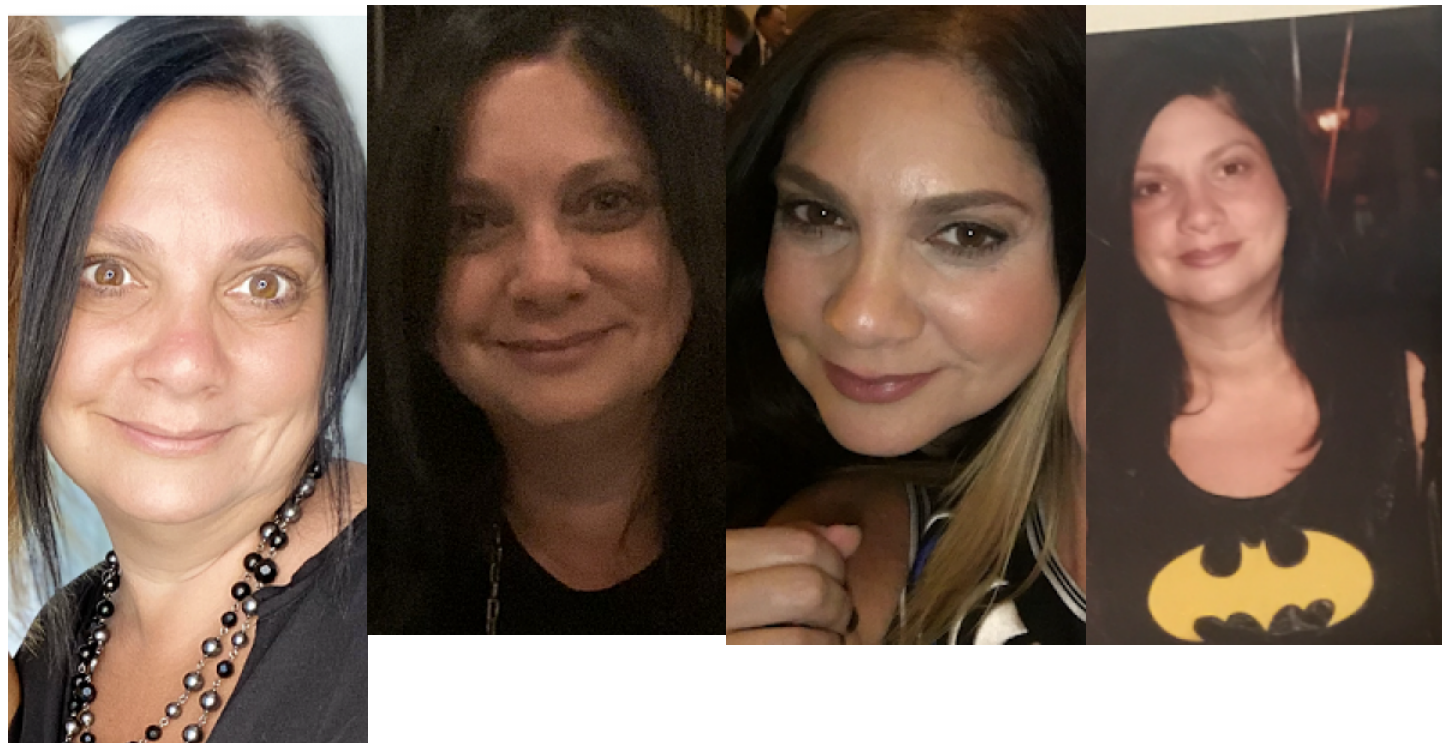
