You can typically find excellent diving conditions and visibility in the off-season and after-season.

Sea Biodiversity

These are significant because they produce a lot of oxygen and provide habitat and breeding grounds for a lot of fish.

virtually always have perfect sailing and diving conditions. Due to the mild water, it makes it an ideal place for diving. Despite the fact that if you dive to a significant depth, the water is as frigid as the rest of the seas!

Calcareous Seabed

Caves, arches, and galleries which you will find on the seabed. Going diving in Mallorca would not be as unique if it weren't for the calcareous composition of our island's seabed.

Safe diving spot

The clear seas, combined with the pleasant sea conditions and the lack of strong currents (and predators!), make learning to dive in Mallorca both simple and safe. Come try it out!

What are the famous dive centers for Scuba Diving Mallorca?

Listed below are some of the famous dive centers where you can go diving in Mallorca:

Cabrera

Cabrera is a small island off the coast of Mallorca that has been protected since 1991. Cabrera is, without a doubt, one of Mallorca's most spectacular dive sites: tight tourist limitations have resulted in an isolated, incredibly diverse underwater world.

Due to the fact that only two dive boats are permitted to visit the island each day, it is essential that you schedule your dive in advance. In exchange, you'll find an incredible amount of species as well as a diversely structured and exceptionally well-preserved ocean floor with up to 90 m of precipitous underwater cliffs. Expect to see barracuda shoals, seahorses, red starfish, dolphins, sea turtles, and corals, all of which may be seen in perfect clarity up to 50 meters

Illa del Toro

The dive site at El Toro, near Santa Ponsa on Mallorca's southwestern coast, is one of the island's most well-known marine reserves. El Toro is an ideal dive location for both novices and experienced divers because of its ideal diving conditions. During your dive, you'll see a lot of different species, including moray eels, scorpionfish, golden redfish, amberjacks, red dragonfish, and wrasses.

With a little luck, you might be able to spot some stunningly patterned seahorses. The ideal hideaway for octopi and conger eels is a 40-meter steep face filled with tunnels, little caves, and grots. Scuba dive in a sea surrounded by shoals of fish and take advantage of the excellent visibility!

Sal Telmo

San Telmo is situated in the southwest corner of Mallorca, just minutes from Puerto de Andratx, Camp

de Mar, and Paguera. The access around thirty unique diving destinations surrounding the island of Dragonera, including wrecks and caves, with their Joker 24 offshore boat in 5–10 minutes. The Dragonera is a natural park, so expect pristine water, schools of barracuda, eagle rays, moray eels, octopuses, and even dolphins and sunfish during the summer.

• Islands of Malgrate

The Malgrats Islands dive site, near Santa Ponsa in the southwest of the island, has been proclaimed a natural reserve since 2004. The underwater flora and wildlife could improve substantially as a result of the stringent constraints and now offer a spectacular underwater habitat. In 2007, a 133-meter-long ship sank in front of the Malgrats Islands, which are now home to a variety of animals and vegetation. The ship is one of the most popular diving destinations on the Malgrats Islands, which have therefore become a veritable underwater paradise.

• Isla del Sec

A truly spectacular dive location may be found in the southwest of the island, directly in front of Sol de Mallorca. Huge shoals of barracudas and a variety of other fish inhabit a rocky plateau that descends to a depth of 32 meters. A submarine was anchored there a few years ago, and in order to provide something unique for the tourists, they sank three ships directly at the dive location. Divers have often performed feeding displays for the fish, and the fish still follow the divers in the hopes of being fed.
