Her training has allowed her to do comprehensive psychiatric evaluations, diagnose, and to prescribe medications across the lifespan. She considers working together as a team, to tailor a treatment plan for every unique individual, pivotal in the success of treatment goals. She works toward reducing the stigma related to mental illness so more people will seek help.

With a broad educational background, Jeanne graduated with her Associate Degree in Nursing from Gulf Coast Community College in 2007. Upon graduating, she started her career as a registered nurse at the Memorial Hospital at Gulfport. Through her experiences as a registered nurse, she became aware of the direct association between the mind, body, soul, and mental health/psychiatry. This encouraged her to further her education to become a psychiatric-mental health nurse practitioner.

Subsequently, she went on to complete her Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from the University of Mississippi Medical Center in 2013, and her Master of Science in Nursing degree from the University of Alabama at Birmingham in 2018.
