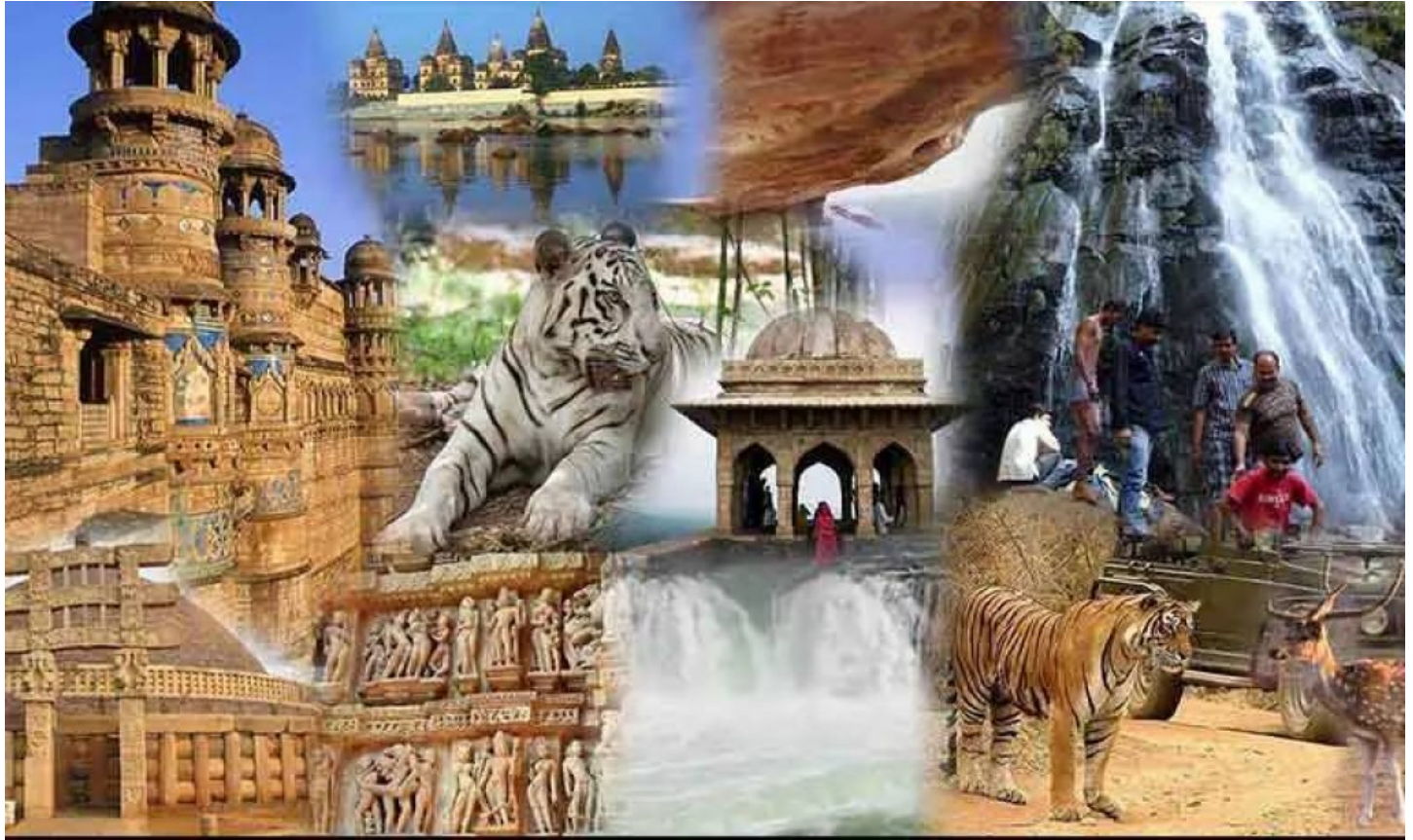


Press Release - Top 5 Tiger Reserves in Madhya Pradesh

Established in 1973, the National Tiger Conservation Authority is responsible for managing India's tiger reserves. The NTCCA oversees Project Tiger. Tigers account for 80 percent of our planet's tiger population. By 2018, there were nearly 3,000 tigers, compared to roughly 1,400 in 2006. Madhya Pradesh has the most tigers (526) in the 1.5-year age bracket, out of all the other states, with around 408 large cats.

Madhya Pradesh is located in the central region of India, or in the geographical center of the country. It is India's second-largest state in terms of land and fifth-largest in terms of people. The state has several traits that make it wealthy and resourceful due to its longitudinal and latitudinal reach. It boasts the greatest diamond and copper deposits in the country, as well as a wealth of mineral resources. MP is

home to some of India's most beautiful temples and historical landmarks. There are also important wildlife sanctuaries in India, and forests encompass more than 30% of the state.

Madhya Pradesh boasts the most wildlife of any state in India. A trip to Madhya Pradesh would be completed without seeing India's national animal, the TIGER! There are ten national parks, six tiger reserves, and twenty-five wildlife sanctuaries in the country. More than 20% of India's tigers are found here.

As a result, it is known as India's Tiger State!

There are over 50 Tiger Reserves in India, yet nothing compares to the magnificent Madhya Pradesh Wildlife. Kanha Tiger Reserve, Pench Tiger Reserve, Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve, Panna Tiger Reserve, Satpura Tiger Reserve, and Sanjay-Dubri Tiger Reserve are the state's six recognized tiger reserves. Kanha, Bandhavgarh, Pench, and Panna are the best tiger reserves in Madhya Pradesh Wildlife, out of the six.

Tigers are the most distinctive cat breed, and seeing one is a thrill. The adrenaline rush of spotting one of these rare and elusive predators in their native environment is unrivaled. While tigers may be found across Southeast Asia and China, India continues to be the most prolific habitat of these majestic creatures, with the largest population numbers.

1 - Kanha Tiger Reserve

Kanha is one of India's oldest wildlife preserves. In 1955, it was designated as a National Park, and in 1879, it was designated as a Reserve Forest. It was thereafter designated as the **Best tiger reserve** in 1973. It is located in the Madhya Pradesh districts of Mandla and Balaghat and has an area of roughly 1949 sq km of wildness.

To mention a few of the animals found in the reserve, there are barasingha, chital, sambar, barking deer, chousingha, gaur, langur, wild pig, sloth bear, and panthers. Its flora and fauna are as diverse as the animals that inhabit it, with over 600 distinct flower types.

The reserve is quite well developed, with all of the contemporary tourist facilities and services. Between November through March, when the days are sunny and the evenings are cool, is the finest time to visit. Elephant and jeep safaris are both thrilling ways to see the wild.

Kanha National Park was named the Best Tourism Friendly National Park by the Department of Tourism, Government of India. It is regarded as one of Asia's best-kept parks.

2 - Satpura Tiger Reserve

The Satpura Tiger Reserve is located in Madhya Pradesh's Hoshangabad district. This **tiger reserve**, which spans 2133.307 square kilometers, is made up of the Bori and Pachmarhi Wildlife Sanctuaries. The reserve provides travelers with fun opportunities to explore the woodland. They may choose from a variety of activities, including jeep safaris, elephant safaris, walking safaris, and canoeing, to mention a few. It is one of India's most peaceful and quiet national parks, having been established in 1981.

In 2010, the TOFT Wildlife Tourism Prize presented Satpura National Park with the award for Most Visitor Friendly Wildlife Destination.

3 - Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserve

Bandhavgarh forest was designated as a **tiger reserve** in 1993. This forest, which is located in Madhya Pradesh's Umaria district, was designated as a National Park in 1968 after the Maharaja of Rewa gave the forest to the state for its creation. This is one of the forests described in the Hindu epic The Ramayana. Lord Rama gave his brother Lakshmana the fort of the Vindhya mountains. The name Bandhavgarh comes from the words Bandhav, which means "brother," and Garh, which means "fort."

Bandhavgarh is Madhya Pradesh's **Best tiger reserve**. Mohan, the gorgeous white tiger, was discovered here. Many other creatures reside here, including nilgai and striped hyenas, and tigers. From October to March, winter is the greatest season to visit this woodland.

Visitors to the Madhya Pradesh Wildlife **famous tiger reserve** can also visit the Khajuraho monument, which is roughly 300 kilometers from the forest and one of the state's most famous historical sites. Khajuraho has been designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and is one of India's top seven marvels.

4 - Panna Tiger Reserve

Panna Tiger Reserve was Madhya Pradesh's fifth and India's 22nd tiger reserve. It is located in the Vindhyan Ranges and spans the Madhya Pradesh districts of Panna and Chattarpur.

The national park was established in 1981, and the Indian government designated it as a **tiger reserve** in 1994. This sanctuary was once utilized as a hunting place by the monarchs of Panna, Chattarpur, and Bijwar. Unfortunately, this resulted in a decrease in the population of tigers in the forest, and subsequently poaching insured that the park's tigers became extinct. Crocodiles and muggers live in the Ken River, which runs through the reserve, among other aquatic creatures and species. It gives a lot of charm to the Madhya Pradesh Wildlife Sanctuary's **Best tiger reserve**.

5 - Pench Tiger Reserve

The River Pench, which runs through the woodland and divides it into two portions, gave the reserve its name. This park is mentioned in Rudyard Kipling's renowned tale "The Jungle Book." This made the reserve famous across the world, and it has since become a popular tourist destination for Indian and international visitors alike. Akela (the Indian Wolf), Raksha (the female Wolf), Baloo (Sloth Bear), and Sher Khan (the Royal Bengal Tiger) are among the book's well-known characters.

The Pench Tiger Reserve is a huge wilderness of 758 square kilometers. This forest, however, has

been home to a variety of animals, gorgeous plants, insects, and other biological species since 1965.

This is the **famous tiger reserve** in Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra to share two states. In comparison to the latter, the section that comes within the state of MP is larger and more well-known.
