
## Skills Council of Canada receives \$3,824,699 funding from Ontario Government

To support Apprenticeship Skills-To-Employment Collaborative Support Ecosystem (CSE)

With an integrated collaboration of partners and employers contributing to the student's needs, we will see an increase in apprenticeship to employment opportunities in Ontario. As individuals have different career ambitions, educational backgrounds, personality types, skill levels, work behaviors, life experiences, work/life balance barriers, and the need for ongoing skills development for sustained employment, the CSE will require many different levels of support and multitude of partners.

"Our government is committed to spreading opportunity more fairly and widely to every corner of our province," said Monte McNaughton, Minister of Labour, Training and Skills Development. "That's why we're investing in this Skills Council of Canada initiative, which will knock down barriers and help 500 youth, women, and Indigenous people take the next step in their careers."
