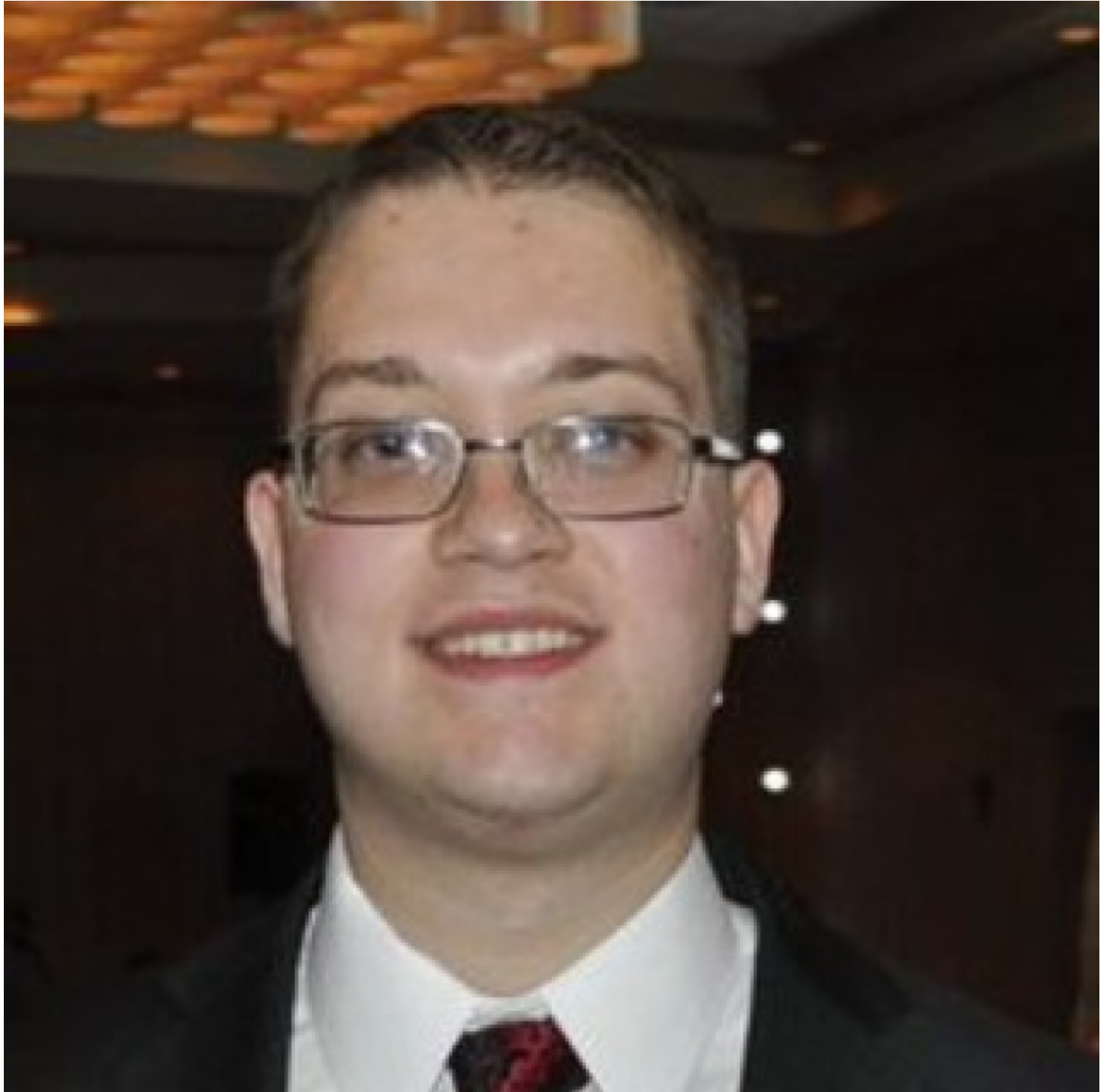


Steven Charles San Filippo, MD, a Family Physician in Private Practice
