The mission of the ABP is to advance child health by certifying pediatricians who meet standards of excellence and are committed to continuous learning and improvement.

In order to remain up to date in her field, she is an active member of the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Society of Critical Care Medicine.

Pediatrics is the branch of medicine that involves the medical care of infants, children, and adolescents. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends individuals be under pediatric care up to the age of 21. Pediatric critical care specialists treat children from birth through the teen years. They choose to make caring for children who are very sick the core of their medical practice. Their advanced training and experience prepare them to give children in PICUs the unique medical care that they need.

As a testament to her success, Dr. Calamur has been the recipient of the Ronald McDonald Children's Hospital Teaching Award (2011), Loyola University Medical Center Magis Star Award (2011), Heartsaver Hero Award (2013), SSMile Award (2014, 2015), Glennon Ambassador Nominee for Exceptional Care (2016), and Ursula Rolfe Award (2017).
