
Omar E. Bellorin-Marin, MD, FACS, FASMBS, a Bariatric and General Surgeon

Finally, he completed his fellowship in advanced GI and minimally invasive surgery at New York-Presbyterian Hospital in 2017.

Distinguished as a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons (FACS) and the American Society of Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery (ASMBS), the doctor is board-certified in general surgery by the American Board of Surgery (ABS). The ABS is an independent, non-profit organization located in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, founded for the purpose of certifying surgeons who have met a defined standard of education, training, and knowledge.

Professionally, he is an active member of the American College of Surgeons, the Society of American Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgeons, the American Medical Association, and the American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery.

Bariatric surgery is a surgical specialty that focuses on weight loss surgery ie: gastric bypass, sleeve gastrectomy, etc. General surgery is a surgical specialty that focuses on abdominal wall hernias and abdominal contents including the esophagus, stomach, small bowel, colon, liver, pancreas, gallbladder, appendix and bile ducts, and often the thyroid gland. A general surgeon performs a wide range of abdominal surgeries for many forms of intestinal and abdominal wall neoplasms, gallbladder disease, and gastric and pancreatic disease. They follow the patient through critical care and surgical recovery all the way to outpatient care.
