Artist To Create First of Its Kind Aerodynamic Glass Water Drop at Museum of Glass



New York City, New York Sep 29, 2022 (<u>Issuewire.com</u>) - On Saturday, October 8, 2022, water activist and designer Tanja Andrejasic Wechsler will meet with up to five of the top glass blowers at the Museum of Glass in Tacoma, Washington to create I AM WATER, a human-sized water drop made solely from glass. Scheduled in the museum's signature 90-foot cone Hot Shop Amphitheater, guests will be able to watch as the artists manipulate the non-toxic, natural material into a first-of-its-kind, large-scale glass sculpture that mimics the real aerodynamic shape of a water drop. Staying true to its nature, I AM WATER will be free blown.

I AM WATER was conceived by Ms. Wechsler in a bold move to raise awareness of water by showcasing the purity of its form and heralds what could be the start of the first big global water campaign that calls for the consideration and respect of water and its powerful life-giving force.

"Out of all environmental and social issues, the most important issue of our time is water," Ms. Wechsler recently stated. "This sculpture represents water speaking and asking to be clean so it can support Life as it's meant to be, restore nature's original blueprint and be available for all."

Considering the devastating damages to water and the search for better solutions that protect our environment, this incredibly unique sculpture will set the stage for a new approach to the water crisis that uses public space and product design to educate the public, inspire a new mindset and practices, and build a better human relationship with water.

The manifestation of this innovative concept will begin as an experiment on the floor of the Hot Shop Amphitheater but will continue its journey nationally and internationally in public spaces to help inspire deeper conversations about water. Glass was selected because Ms. Wechsler believes that glass mimics the clarity and fluidity of water, its delicacy and strength is a similar quality to water, and that it is the most natural material to represent water and remind us of water's beautiful, healing, and life-giving presence.

The creation of this spectacular art piece and exquisite organic design is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for anyone interested in glass as an art form and its relationship to the environment to witness this remarkable feat and to join the collective effort to protect and restore water.

She chose the Museum of Glass by iconic Thea Foss Waterway and their extraordinary glass artistry as the best way to showcase glass in the collective effort to stop polluting water and join the call for hope and respect for Life.
