Many of our men (boys to men) have lived with various issues that affect their ability to function in their own First Nations, with the goal to develop them to become respected leaders and elders of the community.

"Gitpo" is the Mi'gmaq word for Eagle. The Eagle is the symbol of one of the seven traditional teachings of the Mi'gmag people

The focus at the Spirit Lodge is on offering a sense of peer support between different generations in each activity, from boys to elders. It has a cultural group that teaches Mi'gmaq language, and drumming, and traditional wellness initiatives led by Elders and Knowledge Keepers.
