Despite the fact that such a room will obviously lack space, it can be equipped with a sufficient number of hangers for outerwear and shelves for shoes.

Convenient and comfortable size of a closet is 3.5-5 m2. For a room, you need about 2 meters in width and about the same in-depth on the basis that the standard width of shelves and drawers is 40-60 cm (otherwise they will be uncomfortable to use), plus at least 60 cm - for your maneuvers near them.

The best option implies 6-8 m2, which will create a full-fledged dressing room with a full set of necessary functional modules.

What questions do you need to answer yourself?

What should be taken into account when planning and setting up a dressing room? What questions do you need to answer yourself?

- Question 1. Will one person, a spouse, or a family with children live in the apartment? Ideally, each member of the family should have its own separate room (even a small one), but unfortunately in most cases, it is not possible. With a walk-in closet that can hold 2-3 people, everyone should have their own separate area.
- Question 2: Determining how much stuff will be stored in the walk-in closet? A walk-in closet can store basic clothing, and shoes, as well as blankets, duvet covers, pillows, suitcases, large bags, sports equipment, professional gear, etc. The more stuff you have and the more you want to free up other rooms, the more space you need to provide.
- Question 3. Decide how things will be stored. The first thing to do is to divide things into those that are stored hanging and those that need shelves to store them. We end up with a) how many hangers are needed, and b) how many shelves are needed.
- Question 4. How high should the bars be? Recall whether your closet has a lot of coats and coats, how suits will be stored (on separate hangers or on modular hangers), and measure the longest dresses. If your closet has few of these things, you don't need to fit the whole structure. Individual long outfits may well be stored and thrown over one of the rungs.

Once you get a visual idea of your tasks and needs, you should have a certain set of requirements to consider when organizing a dressing room.

Open and closed closet systems open Closets

These systems consist of several open shelves with open shelving that are completely or partially devoid of fronts. The central part is always open but the lower and upper compartments can be closed.

For small rooms, this type of closet will be the most suitable, because it does not involve the use of protruding door sashes (although they will look good in the entourage of a spacious hallway). Also, similar systems, are often used in the design of the transition from the living room to the corridor.

Closets of closed type

Closets of the closed type - it's practically a closet, only very large. Their main advantage is the ability to protect things from prying eyes and dust.

It will be most convenient to install a closed model in a room with a lot of free space. These dressing rooms consist of several compact modular units or are separate rooms (also this system can be identical to the open except for the presence of screens, partitions, or doors).

Closed closets are most often equipped with sliding or folding doors to make better use of space (in rare cases, hinged doors are used).
