

The Storytelling Conclave 2022 rewards works of notable authors across India

Authors from across the country submitted their nominations following which their entries were curated with a rigorous run-through according to the categories applied and 129 finalists were selected for felicitation from the total pool of 2137.

the universe of unethical practices, and ends up uncovering a grisly crime.

A Ghastly Trail—written by **Sudhir Menon** who bagged the Emerging Author of the Year title as well—is based on the adage that “Truth will prevail.” The suspenseful story is a web of twists and turns which would delight even an avid reader and keep them on their toes as they follow the journey of Rajesh Saxena, a meat exporter.

AN-Origins Issue 2 is a fast-paced mystery unfolding Major Vaayu’s story who, unknown to himself, learns about his family—which has existed since our universe’s existence—the powers he can have and the great enemy he must face. **Varun Malhotra** was crowned the Emerging Author of the Year for the same.

Juno Ashok’s *Voice—Rhythms of a Charmaine* titled her the Young Adult Author of the Year. It’s a compilation of poetry and letters from the deepest pits of the author’s heart. The real essence of each work in the collection lies in the way it is perceived and provides the readers a chance to appreciate beauty in honesty.

Hum Ek He Naav Ke Manjhee marked this year’s Poet of the Year. Written by **Reetu Mourya**, it’s a compilation of work depicting present events, the potential for good in them, and how to move on and accomplish the goal. The more you read, the more you develop a stronger emotional connection to the words.

The Woman Writer of the Year was awarded to **Dr. Jamuna J** for *Kids Growth and Nutrition—Live Long Life*. The book deals with ways to improve the immune system to give birth to a healthier baby.

Also a winner of the Woman Writer of the Year award, **Dr. Veda D. Malagatti’s** *Costing For the Service Industry* was written to help the low economy to understand the behaviour of cost and its applications.

The awardee of the Suenos Author 40 under 40 in 2022 is **Dr. Mayurkumar Mukundbhai Solanki**. The book *Human Predicament: Critiquing Vikram Seth’s Novels* is a result of five years of extensive research through personal upheavals of his life. Dr. Mayurkumar summarizes the book as “Good things are likely to happen but bad things happen.”

Facebook Friends bagged **Mahendra Arya** the Best Plot Of The Year award. *Facebook Friends* raises the question of setbacks in your life. It’s a story about two childhood friends taking a life-changing trip together and discovering more about themselves than they imagined.

Varghese V Devasia was crowned the Author of the Year for his book *Women of God’s Own Country*, a poignant tale of women with a purpose. The second awardee of the prestigious award is **Dr Dewakar Goel** for *AIIMS Catch Me If You Can*, bridges fiction with the reality of the life of medical students.
