Your pearly whites have the strongest substance in your body, known as enamel. They might seem as though they are indestructible, but there are millions of Americans yearly who can beg to differ. People have missing teeth for a host of reasons that range from accidents to decay.

Our dentist in Easton, PA, can help solve the missing teeth problem by using dental implants. <u>Dental implants in Easton</u> are an innovative treatment that many dentists recommend if you need a permanent solution for missing teeth.

You can either get full mouth implants or mini dental implants depending on your preferences and our dentist's recommendations.

How Do Implants Work?

In layman's terms, dental implants in Easton are titanium posts that are surgically inserted into your jawbone. They are excellent replacements for your tooth roots since they provide a firm foundation for temporary or permanent replacement teeth.

Since the titanium-based implants fuse to your jawbone in a process known as osseointegration, they are permanently cemented to your jawbone. Bridges and dentures are mounted to the dental implants so that they do not shift or slip from your mouth.

Dentures, bridges, and crowns placed over the implants fit firmly, making them feel more natural than traditional dentures or bridges.

There are instances where ordinary dentures and bridges are not comfortable. Might be because you have poor ridges, sore spots, or gagging. Besides this, conventional bridges need teeth on either side for anchorage and support. Implants solve this problem since they are inserted in the jawbone.

The only issue is that to have dental implants, you need to have adequate bone to support them and healthy gums. Your oral hygiene has to be excellent to maintain these structures.

Types of Implants

There are two types of implants that we offer:

- Endosteal implants which are surgically placed into your jawbone.
- **Subperiosteal implants** which the metal post is placed onto the jawbone beneath the gum tissue

The type of implants that you will have is dependent on how healthy your gums are and if your bone is strong enough to handle the implant.

Full Mouth Implants

At times, you might not be missing a tooth or a couple of teeth, but you are missing all your teeth. An implant-supported denture or bridge is an excellent treatment option that can replace them.

The implants will not only help replace your teeth but also some of your roots. This will help preserve the jawbone. When you use conventional dentures, the bone that was previously surrounding the root starts to deteriorate. Dental implants will help to keep the bone healthy.

How Are Full Mouth Implants Inserted?

Initially, our <u>dentist in Easton</u> will surgically insert the titanium-based post into your jawbone. The healing process will take approximately six months, when the fusing would have taken place.

After osseointegration (fusing of the metal post to your bone), the implants will be uncovered, and then our dentist will attach the extensions. Then some connecting devices that allow multiple crowns to attach will be fixed.

When these connecting devices are held firmly in place, full bridges or dentures are created and attached to the metal posts.

Mini Dental Implants

Do you have some teeth missing, and dental implants are not an option? Mini dental implants could be an excellent option.

There might be times when our dentist can tell you that your bone is not strong enough to get the conventional implants. This is where these implants come in handy.

These implants are typically used to stabilize replacement teeth, and main dentures in the lower jaw. They have a titanium post that has a ball at the protruding end. Crowns can be secured onto the ball and additionally secured using a rubber O-ring.

What Is the Difference Between Mini Implants and Conventional Dental Implants

They differ from conventional implants because of their design and size. These implants are less than 3.3 mm in diameter, whereas traditional implants measure 3.4 – 5.8 in diameter.

They are much simpler in design as compared to conventional because they have a ball at one end with a rubber O-ring that secures the crown.

These implants protrude above the gum line after they have been inserted into the bone. Whereas conventional implants are placed in the jawbone and are under the gums.

These implants can be used for:

- Replacing teeth for patients who do not want to undergo the regular implant surgery
- Replacing teeth for patients whose oral anatomy would not sustain the conventional dental implant
- Replace teeth for patients who are unable to afford traditional implants

Benefits of Dental Implants
