
AboutDrumming.com Releases Free Online Polyrhythmic Metronome For Drummers

Daniel W., who runs <u>AboutDrumming.com</u>, had this to say about the new free tool:




Originally I would count out the beats slowly and learn where to place each hit. I had no way of playing these rhythms to a metronome however since my physical metronome could only play one rhythm at a

time.

That's why I'm very excited to be releasing this metronome - it's going to make it easier for other drummers to explore these wonderful rhythms and to make sure they're playing on time which can be quite difficult to test when you're only counting in your head".
