Approximately, 1200 students have participated in these ongoing sports activities and self-defense training for girls and young students to improve their confidence, build perseverance and improve their physical and mental fitness.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. M A Pathan, President of SPHEEHA said, "The greatest service one can render to humanity is to serve the people for their upliftment and development. This camp has been organised to further our goal of sustainable management of life support ecosystems to protect and preserve the physical environment for the cultural, emotional, and spiritual well-being of all communities and it is in line with the Government of India's vision of development. We want our communities to be self-sufficient in every respect and SPHEEHA is actively supporting and sponsoring various socio-economic and employment opportunities at Rajaborari thereby helping sustain the unique 'Rural Economic Zone' it has evolved into."
