
Urologist Dr. Zamip Patel now provides information for ED surgery patients on new YouTube Channel

As Dr. Zamip Patel's videos explain, surgical options for ED are available after all other treatments have failed. But doctor Patel cautions that videos can provide initial information only; actionable medical advice requires a visit to the doctor.

ED is quite common. According to studies, worldwide approximately 23 percent of men aged 40-80 years have ED symptoms. See https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/books/NBK278925/. This condition is found in men of all ages and the prevalence increases with age. The causes are manifold and can be found in the patient's lifestyle or other medical conditions that can be neurological, hormonal, vascular, or even psychological. Examples of such a Sickle Cell Disorder (SCD) and Diabetes that are related to neurological and vascular issues.

The treatment of ED should begin with a medical exam and review of the patient's medical history. Usually, the doctor will first prescribe medication. If, however, the medication does not produce the desired results, surgery may become an option. Depending on the patient's condition, surgery may be the only treatment option for men with severe ED, such as those with prior physical trauma, prior pelvis surgery, or other medical conditions.

In his series of ED videos on his YouTube Channel, https://www.youtube.com/@Dr.ZamipPatel Dr. Patel explains the procedure, pre-operative management, and post-operative instructions. There is even one video where Dr. Patel explains ED in the Spanish language.

As for surgery, Dr. Zamip Patel points out that "the prospect of an implant may sound scary, but most men who have undergone this type of surgery report satisfactory results. In fact, implants have a high rate of satisfaction compared to other ED treatments."

However, doctor Zamip Patel also cautions that his educational videos can provide generalized information. Proper diagnosis and treatment require a physical exam of the patient and review the patient's medical history.
