To be eligible for the benefits, one must be enrolled in Original Medicare for both Parts A and B and pay the individual premium for Part B. People who are enrolled in this plan and eligible to receive the Medicare Giveback Benefit will not get the checks directly. The receivers will get the payment through their social securities. If the Part B premium was paid through Social Security, the [Part B Giveback](#) will be credited monthly to the Social Security check. However, this eligibility will not work for people who receive Medicaid or any government assistance that helps them pay their Part B premium. The Part B giveback is restricted to
