Under ECO4, eligible participants can enlist the services of companies such as <u>Mulgas</u> for boiler repairs, heating control upgrades, and insulation installations. Homes rated between D to G on the energy efficiency scale are primarily served by this initiative, and renters must secure consent from homeowners to proceed with upgrades.

These government-led interventions are not only critical in the short term for managing costs but also contribute to the country's long-term sustainability goals.
