

Bluesky, the Twitter Alternative Shows Off its Algorithmic Choice with Custom Super Bowl Feeds

Specially prepared for the Super Bowl Fans, on the one hand, there will be a feed focusing on the big game itself and all the conversation for the sports fans and the other one will include the stories of Kelce and Swift which most fans have been waiting for. However, the users are not required to be locked into a particular topic. The algorithmically-driven feed comes with the exception of a wide variety of custom feeds that offer dynamic public content. The developers have also built online tools for custom feed creation, namely Skyfeed and Bluesky Feed Creator. This feature allows any user to create their own custom feed by utilizing a visual editor.

In order to showcase its adaptive capabilities, Bluesky is creating Super Bowl feeds based on two main variations. There will be a Super Bowl LVIII feed which is specially designed for the football fanatics and other feeds will be similar only but also include the buzz about Taylor Swift and Travis Kelce's dating life and relationship. The platform has cleverly named this version "SB (Taylor's Version)." Emily Liu, a member of the Bluesky team said, "Some football fans have strong feelings about not seeing any TS related content in their football news," and the platform is going to cater to their attention.

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
