- 4. License Matters: Consider obtaining a skipper's ticket to operate boats safely and responsibly.
- 5. Experience Matters: Starting small allows for gradual skill development, preventing mishaps often associated with larger boats.

His advice stems from personal experience, emphasising the need for a gradual progression into the boating world and the importance of responsible boating practices.
