## What Is an Indian eVisa?

An Indian eVisa is the legal travel permit to enter and stay in India issued by the Indian Government to foreign nationals since 2014 who are interested in visiting India for tourism, business, or any medical purposes. It allows citizens of 171 countries and territories to apply for this Indian visa online, which you can show at the authorized immigration check posts of India, including 31 airports and 5 seaports when entering.

Tourist eVisa

Business eVisa

Medical eVisa

Medical Attendant eVisa

Transit eVisa

Conference eVisa and Ayush Visa for those who seek medical treatment in India for traditional medical treatments, like Ayurveda, will be added to the list in 2024.

What to Do Before Applying for an Indian Visa Online

Whether it be for tourism, medical needs, or business purposes, applying for eVisa to India is simple and straightforward. It takes just a few minutes to fill out the [online Indian visa application form](#) and upload the necessary documents asked for, such as a scanned bio page of the passport and a recent passport-size photograph along with the return flight ticket. For the information, you must include an active email address, details of a credit or debit card, and the kind of visa you are applying for. Most importantly, you should make the application at least a week before boarding your flight, no matter how long you are going to stay in India.

A step-by-step Guide to Getting an Indian eVisa

The steps to an Indian visa application process are more or less similar to any kind of visa to India you are applying for online. Let us say you are applying for an eVisa for Indian tourists. In this case, you need to provide generic information on the first page of the application form, like information about yourself, your email address, etc. Here, you also have to choose the type of visa you need. For example, there are three different options for a Tourist eVisa to India: 30 days, 1 year, and 5 years.

On page 2 of the application form, you need to fill in more information as asked, including the passport details, identity certificate, etc. On the third page, you need to fill in information regarding your permanent address and eventual marriage status. Page 4 continues with your travel plans, probable ports of exit, places you have visited in India before, and much more. Lastly, you will be asked about your criminal records, if there are any.

In the next step, you need to upload your photos and a photo of your passport to continue the process with the Indian eVisa fee payment. Make the payment using your credit or debit card. If approved, you will receive your visa within three business days.
