
New Album "Waiting for Redemption" by Gedalya, Folk Rock Rabbi, Available for Pre-Save in Advance of September Release

Among the album's highlights are songs like "A Song Was Born," which gives listeners a personal look into Gedalya's life and creative process. The song "In the Passenger Seat" explores life's spiritual journey. "A Troubled Soul" contemplates the burdens that people carry with them. The album's title track, "Waiting for Redemption," is about the soul's longing for redemption.
