Continuing his specialization, Dr. Shah completed a fellowship in cardiology and electrophysiology at the esteemed University of Oklahoma, known for its expertise in ablation and electrophysiology. Following his training, he joined the faculty as an Assistant Professor before relocating to Fort Worth, Texas, in 2000.

Board-certified in both cardiovascular disease and clinical cardiac electrophysiology, Dr. Shah is recognized as a Diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM). The ABIM is a physician-led, non-profit, independent evaluation organization driven by doctors who want to achieve higher standards for better care in a rapidly changing world.

From 2006 to 2016, Dr. Shah served as the Program Director for the Cardiology fellowship program since its inception at Medical City Fort Worth. An electrophysiologist is a type of cardiologist. They focus on the heart's timing or electrical system, and on diagnosing and treating irregular heartbeats or arrhythmias. They are also qualified to perform special tests/procedures on the heart's electrical system, such as an electrophysiology study or an ablation and implanting devices like pacemakers and defibrillators.
