I grew up in a multi-cultural home in this multi-cultural city and this shop is a love letter to my community. We are committed to supporting independent artists by showcasing their work at the store and inviting them as teachers for our classes. Many of our craft kits are imported from Japan, others are just for fun, and the rest will highlight the creativity of Angelenos."

Several classes are available to book (with more currently being scheduled), including a finger-knitting class on May 30, a polymer clay class on June 27, and a cross-stitch class later in July.
