This balance adds layers to the narrative, making it more engaging for contemporary audiences.

Character motivation plays an important role - the element which went missing in the recent most expensive film "Furiosa', despite the impeccable action sequences the film failed to capture the audience not only due to poor plot coherence but most importantly due to lack of character motivation. The seeking should be for scripts where characters are not just plot devices but integral to the story's emotional core. Films that evoke strong emotional responses are more likely to be memorable, Manjumel Boys for instance. Whether it's through humor, drama, or tragedy, a script that connects emotionally with the audience can drive a film's success. Producers should seek stories that have the potential to move and inspire viewers.

The trend in South Indian cinema, particularly in Tamil and Malayalam films, towards prioritizing storytelling over star power, marks a significant evolution in the industry. As audiences become more discerning, the demand for content-rich narratives is driving a new wave of cinema that values originality, character depth, and social relevance. For producers, this shift presents both challenges and

opportunities. Investing in story-driven films requires a keen understanding of what makes a compelling narrative and the ability to nurture projects that may not have traditional star appeal but possess the potential for critical and commercial success.
