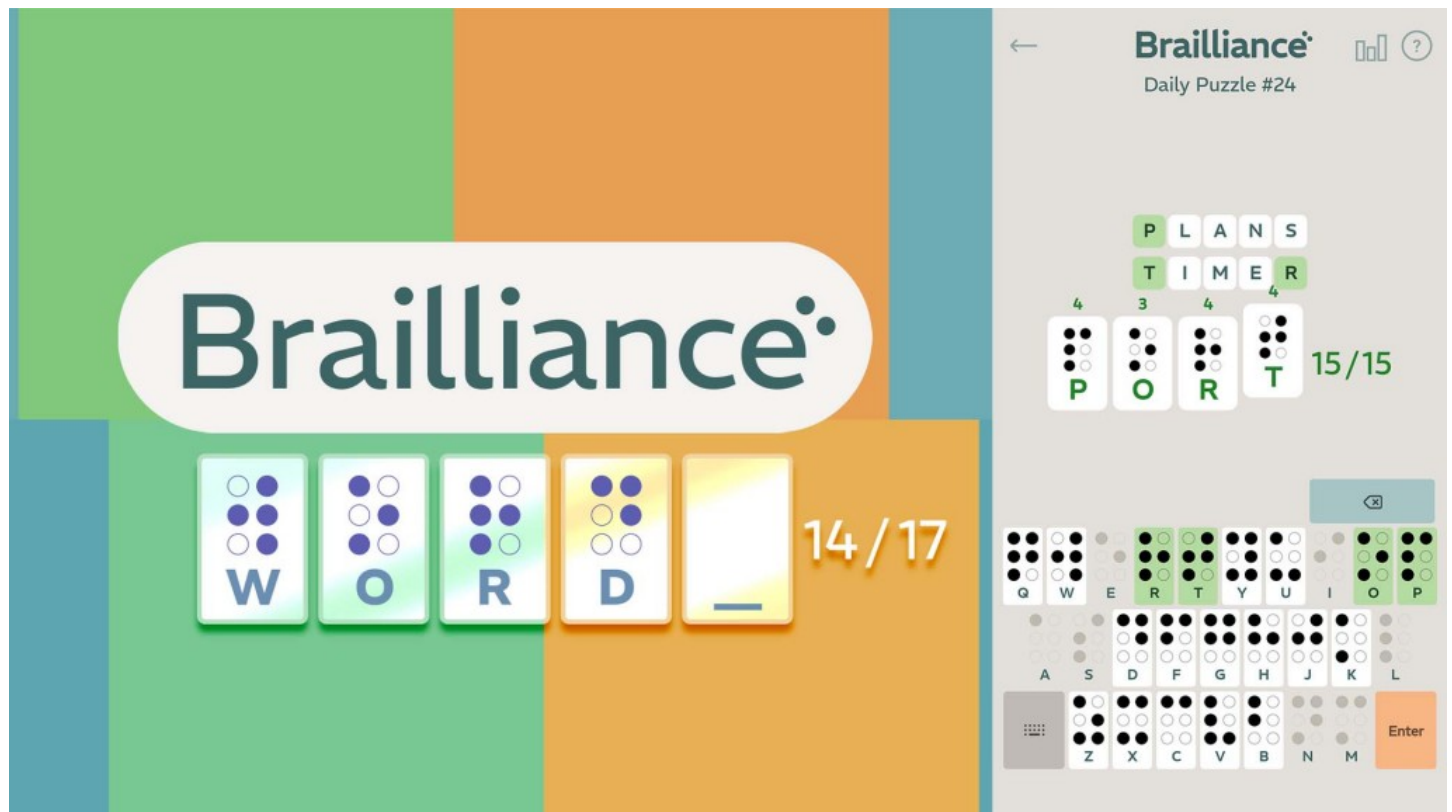


New Word Game Shines a Spotlight on the Braille Alphabet
