
Celebrating a Legacy of Excellence in Surgical Oncology: Charles M. Balch, MD, FACS, FASCO, Five-Decade Journey

Dr. Balch's leadership extended beyond MD Anderson, as he took on significant positions, including President and CEO of the City of Hope National Medical Center, Executive Vice President and CEO of the American Society of Clinical Oncology, and Professor of Surgery at Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions. In 2015, he returned to his roots at MD Anderson, where he continues to practice as a Professor in the Department of Surgical Oncology, Division of Surgery.

Author of over 850 publications, Dr. Balch's work has had a profound impact on the biomedical landscape, accumulating over 35,000 citations—an average of 75 citations per article. His influence is felt globally, with lectures delivered in more than 42 countries and numerous contributions to academic institutions across the United States.

Dr. Balch is also the founding Editor-in-Chief of the "Annals of Surgical Oncology", recognized as the premier journal in its field. He has authored the authoritative textbook on melanoma, "Cutaneous Melanoma", now in its 6th edition. His commitment to cancer patient education is exemplified through the initiation of "Resource Cancer Guides", which distributes nearly one million cancer guides annually to patients seeking information on various cancer topics.

Throughout his career, Dr. Balch has organized and participated in randomized surgical trials that have set the standards for melanoma surgery. These include his role as Principal Investigator for the Intergroup Melanoma Surgical Trial and leadership in multi-institutional clinical trials involving adjuvant therapies for high-risk melanoma patients. His research has been integral in shaping the staging of cutaneous melanoma, with methodologies adopted worldwide.

Dr. Balch's leadership extends into numerous professional organizations, where he served as President of the Society of Surgical Oncology, the Association of Academic Surgeons, and the International Sentinel Node Society, among others. He holds honorary memberships in various national and international societies. He has received accolades such as a Ph.D. degree (Honora causa) from the University of Crete and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the British Association of Surgical Oncology.

In addition to his professional commitments, Dr. Balch is actively involved in volunteer work with not-for-profit organizations, including Health Volunteers Overseas and the American College of Surgeons Foundation. His passion for philanthropy and community service is evident in his leadership roles across various organizations, including Manned Space Flight Education Foundation, NASA Space Center Houston (Founding Board of Directors), and Undying Hope International (Chair, Board of Directors).

Outside of his professional life, Dr. Balch is an avid traveler and photographer. He is fond of exploring Asia, Europe, and Africa on safari. His diverse interests enrich his life and inspire his work in oncology.
