He has also served as the Medical Director of the Pediatric Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Center of Excellence and Co-Medical Director of the Heart Failure and Transplant team, reflecting his commitment to excellence in pediatric cardiac care.

Dr. Martinez's clinical and research interests focus on cardio-oncology and cardiovascular genetics. He has been a clinical researcher for the cardio-genetics team at Texas Children's Hospital, participating in numerous studies aimed at combating heart failure, exploring cardio-genomic profiles, and assessing therapy-related cardiovascular dysfunction in childhood cancer survivors. His expertise has made him a sought-after leader in the field, and he has served as an editor for a textbook on mechanical circulatory support while being elected Chair of the International Cardio-Oncology Society's Pediatric Group.
